The remaining eight players played a round robin in two leagues with the winners from each competing in the final.



Early this month you should have received your membership renewal either by email or post.


Please make sure you reply and let Judy know of any changes in your details.

Eight years ago, as a result of a taster session organised by the local council, two disabled bowlers with the support of their families began regular bowling sessions at their local club. From those small beginnings the group has grown to a membership of over 25 players meeting every Friday 12 till 2pm, 12 months of the year.



The Coe family have been involved from the beginning with their daughter Sabrina being a driving force, bundle of energy and enthusiasm for the game. Sabrina's grandmother, Nanny Peg as she was known, joined five years ago and loved the time she spent with the group. Sadly, Nanny Peg pass away 18 months ago and it was in her memory that the family chose to support the BDA HPS trial day at Desborough.



The group itself attracts members from over 20 miles away, and as well as bowling, the members enjoy the social support and friendships they make, often meeting away from the bowls'. As well as playing in the group, their members have been encouraged to fully integrate with the club, playing regularly in leagues and other events.
