INTERNATIONAL BOWLS for the DISABLED



IDB General Assembly

Steve Watson attended the IBD General Assembly online on recently and here is a brief summary of the key points which were was discussed :

1. The IBD world Championships will take place 18-31 May 2024 in Gauteng region, (near Johannesburg) South Africa

2. There will be played Men's & Women's Singles & Pairs in B1, B2, B3, B4, B6, B7, B8 and each player playing within their own classification group.

3. There maybe be a B5 group if there are enough entries from around the world .

4.As many **competitive players** as you wish can take part in each Classification Group.

Letters of Intent to Enter will be sent to DBE in January 2023.

Please Note: At the moment It will be DBE Policy that this event will be Self-Funded – We will look at putting in place a selection criteria to ensure we send a Competitive England team in all classifications to attend this event, once full entry information has been received early in the New Year.

Also mentioned ;

1.Visual Impaired Classification is under full review for all sports by the International Paralympic Committee (IPC), and this could take up to 2 years to sort – IPC only recognise B1, B2 & B3 Not B4

2.Commonwealth Games/World Bowls para bowls formats/ Scheduling/country selection Criteria are under full review.

More information will follow once it is received.

I was recently invited to meet a group of bowlers with learning difficulties who play once a week at Northampton and District IBC.

The group is organised through JH Community Support, who work in the Bedford/Northampton area provided support to people with learning disabilities to become more independent and lead fulfilling and rewarding lives. They use sport as one means of achieving this, they have a group that meet every Thursday morning at Northampton and District to play a game of bowls and they love it. They are already planning on getting their own bowls, (that's Christmas sorted) and equipment. When I was there they were playing a match with some players from the club and looked like they were having a great time and demonstrating some great skills.

The club and JH Community Support are keen to offer the opportunity to play to a wider audience of people with a disability and are hoping to start another regular session on a Tuesday afternoon. The club itself already has some disabled players and recently purchased a second electric wheelchair for them to use.

One thing the group would like to do is to arrange matches with other clubs, if you know of a club that runs a regular disabled group please let me have their details and if they are willing perhaps we can link them up with other groups in their area to arrange some friendly games.

As well as bowls JH Community Support enable their clients to find some work experience, and one of the most popular is at Northampton Rugby club where they man the turnstiles for the clubs home games. They also play snooker and attend respite breaks at an outward bounds centre. Josh, who organises the team is thrilled they are being given the chance to try bowls, new sport and keen is to involve more people. This is a great community project and is working equally well for the club.
