Fundraising and the future of DBE

The lifeblood of any charity is Fundraising, Donations & Sponsorship events, and we are no different from any other charity in the country during these difficult times trying to raise money during the cost-of-living crisis.

With the charity sector funding drying up and no Government or Sports Bodies' funding available for disability grassroots development, players performance pathway and administration, we are running out of time and funds to save this great organisation,

Mike McDonagh has volunteered to assist us in raising funds and has written over 100 letters to different companies and potential sponsors to date with no success as they are overwhelmed with requests from charities. We are asking our members to think outside of the box and come forward with some good fundraising ideas or help to kick start our fundraising for 2024?

We endeavour throughout the year to maintain a full calendar of events across England for the different disability groups and our membership with friendly social fixtures, competitions, taster & disability awareness days, club disability facilities guidance and new equipment design assistance, but most importantly we offer a Structure for Disability Bowlers and likeminded across England.

The money raised during this period will be ringfenced and divided equally between:

Grassroots development Including:

- Increase & retain playing membership across all levels of disabilities.
- Increase the number of Disabled friendly clubs.
- Increase the number of taster days and disability awareness workshops.
- Continue to work on improving Disability bowls equipment and walking aids.
- Provide extra support and training for disability Coaches, volunteers, and regional ambassadors.

Learning disabilities development:

- Recruit and support a volunteer workforce comprising helpers, coaches, ambassadors & fund raisers.
- Increase the number of Open and Learning Disabilities events across the different Learning spectrum.
- Provide specialist support & training for the Learning Disabilities group of players and member clubs.

International teams coaching and support:

- Build on the success of the 2022/23 indoor & outdoor season on the International & World stage.
- High level Specialist coaching for the different classification groups.
- Competitive training camps & team building exercises.

Cancellation of Para Indoor Home Nations 2024

It is with great regret and sadness that I have to inform the membership that due to lack of financial support the Trustees of Disability Bowls Charity Trust have had to make the difficult decision to withdraw DBE Team England from the Indoor Test Match against Wales in March.

This will enable us to fulfil the remainder of the 2023/24 Indoor Season and the 2024 Outdoor season without putting the Charity into debt, which would undo all the hard work that has been done over the past 40 years to make our sport inclusive and "Proving Bowls is for Everyone".

This has been a very tough decision for the Trustees, but with the charity sector funding drying up and no Government or Sports Bodies' funding available for disability grassroots development, players performance pathway and administration, we are running out of time to save this great organisation that has changed the lives of so many people with a disability by enabling them to play the game of bowls, not only for social and recreational purposes but with the chance of progressing to represent their country at international level.

The Trustees wish to **assure you**, if our financial position changes over the next few months, we will review this decision. Steve

What a great start to 2024!







Over 26 and 27 January we welcomed a development team from the Irish Bowls Federation to Solihull for a couple of days of practice, a classification clinic, a coaching session with Mal Evans and a test match.



This was the first time that the Irish Bowls Federation have sent a para team over and it was a great pleasure and privilege to host the event. Hopefully there will be more of these events in the future and we very much look forward to meeting up with everyone again. There was a great buzz throughout both days with banter, fun and positivity in spades.



Day 1 started with some skills tests across 6 rinks, much laughter could be heard across the green and it proved a great ice breaker. The second session was quick format pairs with players re-drawing for partners every four ends. In the afternoon the teams played a 'trial 'test match, some great skills were displayed and with honours even it was all to play for on Day 2.

Day 2 began with a Classification clinic; 5 of the Irish team and 3 DBE members were up for assessment or review.

We were delighted that Mal Evans, Director of Coaching at Bowls England, was able to come and run coaching sessions for us that morning as well. Mal is an excellent and experienced Coach and all the players and management were totally engrossed and involved with what he had to say and how he demonstrated ways to learn and improve skills. It was good to see everyone participating fully in the session, and equally good to hear all the laughter and banter across the rinks.

The final event was the Test Match in the afternoon, consisting of 5 pairs games. There was some great bowling across all five rinks. Khalila Hussain and Emma Price had a great win 23-9 against some tough Irish opposition; Alex Comack and Colin Wagstaff put in a big finish winning their last 7 ends but losing narrowly by 10-13; Dave Wood (directed by Rick Sippitts) and Phil Dutton (directed by Elizabeth Shipley) were in strong form and won 29-5; Kevin Betteridge (directed by Jayne Sippitts) and John Hollowell (directed by Lidka Hollowell) also had an excellent win 27-4. The final match was a nail-biter with Colin Milner and Craig Bowler down by 1 with one end to play, needing 2 to win – holding one shot with his last bowl still to play, "Captain" Craig drew another and clinched the game.
